NASSAU CHAPTER 2023-24 ~UNITED IN CHARITY~



Before I talk about the many activities of the 2023-24 Nassau Chapter it is imperative that my major thank you goes out to my brothers: our chaplains, those who served as officers and staff, the past chapter presidents, chapter program chairs and of course the forty-five plus councils of the Nassau Chapter.

We launched the year with a picnic and followed up with the inaugural appreciation afternoon. This event was a way for the chapter to usher in the new Columbian year by acknowledging the importance of grand knights, district deputies, conference officers and the Columbiette leadership. Next up was Trivia Night, led by our State Deputy, Anthony Ippolito, and his family. A second event in November was our Chapter Memorial Mass where we remembered those who have gone on before us. In December we hosted the annual Christmas party and past chapter president testimonial. The Chapter rolled right into the new year with the Chapter Retreat, followed by a new event, a boxing exhibition night. Through the vision of Bro. Damiano Coraci \$21,000 was raised, with donations to the Chapter as well as 2 other charities.

The high point of the year was the annual Chapter Ball and this year did not disappoint in any way. Through a combination of sponsorships, raffles and journal ads, the Nassau Chapter was able to make a \$75,000 donation to the Life Center, award \$10,000 to the Major Raffle winner and \$2,000 in prizes to the Spring Raffle winners. During the ball the Knight of the Year, Columbiette of the Year and Lifetime Achievement awards were presented.

Rounding out the year was the distribution of over \$5,500 in high school, elementary and CCD scholarships, \$2,000 for a college scholarship, \$7,000 to purchase a Blessed Fr. McGivney statue, \$300 for the Shrine of Our Lady in Suffolk County, and \$500 donation to the Seminary of the Immaculate Conception.

The Nassau Chapter maintains an ongoing Fraternal Assistance program to help those who have a financial need. The Chapter Vice-President receives the request which is in turn validated with the potential recipient not being made aware. At the end of the process, valid requests are honored with a check. The fraternal assistance program has its own raffle with \$2,000 in prizes.

In conclusion, we end where we started, the Chapter was only able to achieve such success by the efforts of so many Nassau Knights and Columbiettes. Thank you and God bless all.

2,557 pints collected from 37 drives Average of 63 pints per drive Nassau Chapter Blood Drive Chair Report

This year is the 10 year during which I have had the pleasure of chairing the Nassau Chapter's Blood Drive Committee. The Committee keeps track of the number of lifesaving pints of blood that are donated through blood drives that are sponsored by Councils in Nassau County and also acknowledges blood donated by individual Knights at established blood collection sites in the County. The Chapter recognizes these generous Knights and Councils by awarding a plaque to the Council which has organized the most pints of blood during the preceding Columbian year.

Over the last nine years, the Knights in our Chapter have been responsible for the collection of 23,600 pints of blood. Not surprisingly, the amount of blood collected during the years of the pandemic were decreased, as there were fewer organized blood drives. We collect an average of 55-60 pints for each drive that is held, so the annual number is a reflection of the number of drives that we are able to organize each year. This year, we have collected 2182 pints year to date, only 100 pints less than the last pre-COVID year at the same time.

There have been a few outstanding Councils over the years. Floral Park Council, by partnering with the community and their Fire Department and by identifying a worthy cause for their drives, has been the perennial leader in collecting the most blood. Holy Family Council collected 101 pints in their February drive. And, in their first ever blood drive, San Patricio Council collected 99 pints in March of this year.

Want to take a crack at winning the award for collections this year? All you have to do is organize one or two extra drives each year. If your Council has never held a blood drive, designate a member to chair a committee for your Council and have them contact the New York Blood Center at (516) 478-5026 or (516) 478-5006, and the very personable managers of Business Development will give you all the information you need to help you set up a blood drive date and location.
